

Varghese George, PhD



Dr Varghese George is the chair of the Department of Population Health Sciences and Professor of Biostatistics & Data Science in the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University. He received his doctorate in Statistics from the University of Missouri-Columbia, followed by his post-doctoral fellowship in Statistical Genetics at the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans under Professor Robert Elston. He continued his career on the faculty of the Department of Biometry & Genetics at LSUHSC, the Division of Biostatistics at the Medical College of Wisconsin and the Department of Biostatistics at the University of Alabama at Birmingham, serving as director of biostatistics graduate programs at Wisconsin and Alabama. He joined the Medical College of Georgia in 2005 as professor and chair of the department of Biostatistics. He has a well-established track record of methodological and collaborative research in Biostatistics, Statistical Genomics and Genetic

Epidemiology. He has served as director of a NIAMS-funded Annual Short Course in Statistical Genetics, co-director of a NHLBI-funded post-doctoral training program and co-director of a NIDDK-funded Annual Short Course in Statistical Genetics. Currently, he is the Director of the Biostatistics and Data Management Core of the Program Project Grant with NHLBI, "*Stress-related Mechanisms of Hypertension Risk in Youth*". He is a fellow of the American Statistical Association and elected member of the International Statistical Institute.
